Suggestions from Members and Local Chapters of OSA

- 4. The host families of Oriya students should be encouraged to join OSA.
- 5. OSA should sponsor Oriya cultural artists (singers, dancers and musicians) for a tour in the United States and Canada. Some of our members have talked to several outstanding artists in Orissa and we are now working on this suggestion.
- 6. The functions of various officers of OSA should be defined in the Constitution and Bylaws of the Society.

We would be pleased to receive our members' reactions to these suggestions as well as new ideas and other suggestions.
