GADADHARA DUTTA IS DEAD. A prominent congress worker, ex-chief whip and social worker died on September 1, 1973 at his Tatpur Home, due to gastic trouble. He was 67.

NAVAL TRAINING CENTER IN ORISSA. The India Government has finally concented to open a Naval Training Base in Lake Chilka of Orissa. The center has promised to preserve the environment of Lake Chilka.

RECENT DEATH TOLL due to Flood in Orissa has gone up to twenty one. Distincts of Cuttack, Balasore Puri, Dhenkanal Sambalpur and Mayurbhanta are severly affected. Reelection for the Orissa state legislative assembly will be held during the 1st quarter of 1974. The election commission of India is yet to announce an exact date.
