THE FOURTH ANNUAL CONVENTION NEWS
OF
O.S.A.

The Annual Convention of OSA was held on July 6th 1974 in the University of Maryland Campus Chapel. Dr. Krushamohan Das presided over the convention. Dr. Sashi Bhusan Mohanty a faculty of the University delivered the welcoming address. The treasurer of the society Dr. Anilaya K. Patnaik presented the accounts. During the course of his presentation Dr. Patnaik praised the contribution of Oriya Ladies during the previous convention by preparing delicious Oriya dishes. He pointed out the inefficiency of the executive committee and the resignation of the President of the society. The blame was given on the geographical distribution of the Executive Committee members, which ultimately prevented them to take any action on almost anything. Dr. Patnaik emphasized on the fact that, lack of achievements on the part of the OSA has created serious concern among some established members and which might alternately pose a threat to the existence of the society. He concluded his speech with an appeal to increase the membership fees and to assign local chapters the responsibility of collecting membership dues.

Prasada K. Patnaik the General Secretary and the Editor of the OSA News Letter presented his problems regarding the irregular publications of the news letter. He appealed everyone to send some form of news regularly so the news letter could be published in time. Members like Dr. Subudhi, Dr. Mangaraj and Mr. Rabi Ray praised the new look of the news letter. Dr. Subudhi emphasized on the fact that the News Letter should contain more Oriya literature.

His announcement to donate an Oriya typewriter for the society was received with an applaud from the audience. Mr. Rabi Ray questioned the activities of the OSA and its contribution to the growth of the Society. He said the OSA had a natural growth, and there is lack of interest to provide enough scope to discover talents among Oriyas. Mr. Ray concluded his remarks with an appeal to financially strengthen the Society. Dr. D. Mangaraj remarked during his speech that the OSA has a Pyramedic structure. It needs more organization and cooperation and effort should be made to bring representatives from each part of the country to participate in the convention. Dr. Mangaraj along with Dr. Subudhi emphasized on the INTERNAL REVENUE ADMINISTRATION'S registration of OSA as a non-profit organization, so that people could get tax credit for donating to the Society, thus, would solve the financial problem of the organization. Mr. Sasi Bhusan Baral criticized the Oriyas settling in U.S.A. He accused that, those intellectuals who came here and settled seize to contribute to the growth of Orissa and this brain drain has caused several problems in the country. Dr. K. M. Das and Dr. Subudhi tried to clarify some of the remarks made by Mr. Baral and appealed not to make an emotional evaluation of Oriyas settled in U.S.A. They said that Oriyas no matter where they stay, could be as patriotic as any one living in Orissa. Dr. G. C. Das proposed some constitutional amendments. They are, raising membership fees to \$10.00, accepting OSA News Let-

Editor as an executive member and the present election procedure and extending the tenure of the O.S.A. executive committee to two years. All these amendments were passed and a constitutional Amendment Sub Committee was formed with Dr. Monindra K. Mohapatra as the Chairperson. The other members are Dr. G. C. Das, Mrs. Rabi Ray, and Dr. Kalpataru Kanungo.

At the end Dr. G. C. Das gave an official reply to all participants and suggested the creation of a Nomination Committee to elect new office bearers for the next year. The following members, that is, Dr. A. Patnaik, Mr. Samar Bhuyan, Mr. Promode K. Patnaik, Jyana Das were elected to the committee along with Dr. Gouri C. Das as the Chairman.

At the end Dr. Krishna M. Das delivered his presidential address with a note of thanks to all members, those who participated in the discussion and attended the function. He praised the democratic spirit of the members for their openness in discussing the problems. Dr. Das was optimistic about the future of the organization, and welcomed the creation of Youth section and Lady's section of the Society. The official discussion of the Society was ended at 7:00 p.m.

NEWS BRIEF FROM ORISSA

Prof. Golak Behari Dhall, the renowned Oriya writer and educator is dead. His premature death was a shock to the entire Orissa. Mr. Surajmal Saha, M.P., syndicate member of Utkal University is also dead due to heart attack. Mr. Pramod Pati the Oriya film producer is dead. Orissa is suffering from severe draught. There is not enough food to feed the entire population. Unemployment is rampant. Jayaprakash Narayan is visting Orissa during middle of February. The communist backed minority government of Nandini Satpathy is struggling hard to survive.
