Dear All,

The Italian island of Sardinia has more than six times as many centenarians as the mainland and ten times as many as North America. Why so? According to psychologist Susan Pinker, it's not a sunny disposition or a low-fat, gluten-free diet that keeps the islanders healthy - it's their emphasis on close personal relationships and face-toface interactions. According to researcher Julianne Holt-Lunstad, the top two factors that contribute to a long life are, not cutting out alcohol, cigarettes or taking regular exercise, but close social relationships and meaningful social interactions.

We as humans are naturally social. Yet, the modern way of life has greatly reduced the quantity and quality of social relationships. Although further research is needed to determine exactly how social relationships can be used to reduce mortality risk, but we must acknowledge that social relationships influence the health outcomes of adults and should take social relationships as seriously as other risk factors that affect mortality.

Many of us immigrated to this countries do not have close relatives nor even extended families. However, we all share the same root, same ethnicity, and same heritage – Odia. It surely makes sense to give this a name – Samparka (외ペー). We should not hesitate to call other odia brothers or sisters as our samparkiya (외ペー).

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OSA's vision is to strengthen our "samparka", build a healthy relationship, during the tough AND good times, during the low AND high points of life. We need all the elders' blessings for our kids to grow-up to a special human being, we need someone to say "ବୁଢାଟିଏ ହେଇଥା" once a while, we need someone press our cheeks to make us smile.

No one knows what life will bring tomorrow, no one can anticipate when the racial profiling or discrimination state will get better, not just for the immigrants like us but for our children who have not seen home other than this country.

Challenges are high, but staying as one other's samparkiya will relieve many of our stress and uncertainty.

AN INTERESTING SEMINAR THAT (ALMOST) EVERYONE MISSED

With all the razzle dazzle of the core events at OSA2018, you probabl y did not notice the seminar:

Ready, Set, Launch. How to Guide Your Teens to a Career that Gives Them Passion, Purpose & Fulfillment

Unfortunately the seminar was double booked at the same time as the Pramod Patnaik Drama Competition, and also unfortunately placed in the hotel, about a mile away from the Drama Competition venue at the Ford Community& Performing Arts Center. This report is for the 99.99% of those at OSA2018 who were not at the Seminar.

The seminar speaker was Mani Purohit, daughter of Padmini and Arjun, of Kingston, Ontario, Canada. Mani started off by giving a thumbnail sketch of her life, leading to the how, why, and wherefore was she talking to us aboutcareer counselling for teens, and teens of all ages.

After completing B.Com. and MBA (both at Queens Univ., Kingston), she became a Chartered Accountant (CPA). Mani first joined Trans Canada Pipelines, and later Ontario Hydro Corp, then one of the largest power companies (probably the largest) in US and Canada, with a collection of hydro, nuclear, coal and gas power plants and transmission lines. Mani worked her way up the ladder, and somewhere along the line she found that working with numbers and statistics was not fun; she disliked her job, and that she really enjoyed working with people. There followed a shift into Human Resources (HR). Ontario Hydro had become too large, and was split into three corporations. Mani oversaw the HR issues involved in the three way split; her excellent work was recognized with a President's Medal. She rose to became Senior Director (HR) at Ontario Hydro. Later Mani joined a multinational based in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, Rockwell International, as Vice-President (HR).

It is worthwhile remembering that Mani was of the first wave of Indian children of that first wave of Indian professionals arriving on North American shores in the sixties. In most localities, each immigrant family was a pioneer. Most white residents had never seen anyone from India, let alone have as a neighbor. Even as the first wave parents faced their own struggles of professional acceptance and survival in an alien society, the children were trying to survive and achieve as the lone brown child in an otherwise all white classroom. The image of Indians at

that time was that of people coming from a poverty stricken starving

country. Later waves of migrants and immigrants from India were much facilitated by the struggles and achievements of that first wave of immigrants and their children.

Even though impressive, the main thrust of the seminar was not the successful climb up the corporate ladder by Mani. Rather the focus was on when Mani discovered that she hated her chosen career path of B.Com > CPA > MBA, and realized that she really loves working with people and switched to HR. The story became poignant and moving when Mani started talking about her experiences and struggles (and turmoil), as the brown skinned woman carving her path through the glass walls and ceilings in white male dominated corporation management. It started as the lone non-white girl in class. Mani so much wanted to be accepted, which ultimately ended up in wishing that she was born white, not Indian. Part of this dark wish was assuaged with her first marriage, and change of surname to Goulding.

The career path of an Indian woman professional up the corporate ladder is doubly full of obstacles and ceilings. There is always the extra effort needed to dress appropriately and speak appropriately to be accepted as 'one of the boys'. The name Mani Goulding is sufficiently neutral so that in meetings and presentations she was not prejudged as 'not-one-of-us' before actually seeing and hearing her by her professional colleagues. Life was somewhat easier.

An unexpected bonus at the seminar was the participation of another young lady born and brought up in India, Susreeta Badpanda, who spoke of her own struggles in her path up the management in US corporations. It turned out that Susreeta was a distant cousin of Mani, but they had never met. Susreeta spoke of how her path in US mirrored Mani's, of the extra effort needed to be professional and competent, and to appear professional and competent for the white male colleagues, and still be a nurturing mother, wife and housewife.

As Mani and Susreeta spoke about their struggles as brown women in a white man's world, there was in the composition of the audience, a `photo negative'. In this audience of all brown people, taking it all in was a lone white male, Jan Trzeciakowski, a nuclear engineer from Poland, Mani's 2nd husband. Jan listened to Mani's presentation, and interjected on occasions.

As senior management in HR, Mani interviewed and counselled many, and discovered that many lacked enthusiasm for their jobs and careers, and felt imprisoned and `locked in', all due to absence of any real counselling during their youth as to what was to be the actual life in a specific profession. Performance in required courses needed to qualify, or course contents, are no indicators of the later drudgery and misery (if you are uninterested in your work). The counsellors in school or college rarely paint a realistic picture. The overt or covert pressures from

parents and the community for a specific profession are tied to their image of the prestige and standing of the profession.

A family friend with a confused child, requested Mani to counsel her. Others heard about Mani's counselling, and requested counselling for their own offsprings. Mani realized that she enjoyed a sense of fulfilment, and decided to do this fulltime. She has stepped down from being Vice-President of Rockwell International, to make herself available for career counselling for the youth and the not-so-young, everyone who needs.

It so happens that a few months ago I got a phone call from a friend (not an Odia). He told me he and his wife were at their wits end. It was about his daughter, who dropped out after two years in medical school, then did a Masters, had an unpleasant experience of her thesis supervisor publishing her research without giving her due credit. She became sufficiently traumatized, suffered self-doubt, questioned her own competence to achieve anything. She now just lies around, unable and unwilling to do anything. To her the future is blank and bleak. The parents just did not know what else to do and where to turn. As I sat through Mani's presentation, I kept thinking of my friend's daughter. I wish she could have been counseled by Mani before she opted for the aborted foray into a medical career.

There are those of us who are lucky (or determined) enough to be certain of a chosen path, with sufficient confidence in our judgement. Then there are others who vacillate and dither, unable to withstand parental or societal pressures, and yet not able decide on their own likes and dislikes. It is these that Mani wishes to counsel, based on her extensive experience as a HR executive, and her personal struggles.

My regret is that the seminar was missed by those who could have benefi ted, by teens vacillating on a future path, and their parents. For them I s uggest a look at the webpage

ODIA SHORT STORY TRANSLATION PROJECT

To propagate Odia literature to American (and second generation) readers, a project has been initiated to translate 35 contemporary Odia short stories and publish an anthology. A 300 pages anthology will be released during June 2019 in New York city. From Achyutananda Pati (born 1927) to Paramita Satpathy (born 1965), all these 35 writers are currently considered top Odia storytellers. Five to Seven translators will be engaged in this project for 6 months. Manuscript will be reviewed by American Odia second generations and American English professors to make sure the quality of translation is satisfied to American standard.

This anthology will be made available to American libraries and South Asian studies departments of American universities. If the project clicks, two more such anthologies will be produced, one with the writers who are no more with us and another anthology of relatively younger voices.

We will maintain global quality both in translation and production. This is first such initiative ever. We have already sent the invitation

MY TRIP TO ODISHA

I got off the plane ramp unsteadily, gripping my luggage so it wouldn't careen from side to side. "18 hours on a plane just to get here - a dusty, sweltering place of rock and sand," I thought as I continued to walk.

I groggily opened my eyes a fraction, allowing a sliver of the light to pass through. The hot, dry air almost forces them to close, but I'm determined to keep them open. After all, I hadn't endured an entire day of screaming babies and bad airplane food to see nothing.

France has lights. Switzerland has mountains. India has people. I was almost overwhelmed - in the U.S., the roads are dominated by cars. Here, they belong to the crowd. A rickshaw driver zoomed past on his rusty bike, while a group of students wearing sharp uniforms edged past. To me, the scene was one of organized chaos - I marveled at the harmonious way in which the people maneuver their way around cars, motorcycles, and other pedestrians. The dogs lazily sleeping in the middle of the road and the cows grazing on shoots of grass sprouting from the sidewalk did little to stem the fluid movement of the people. In an attempt to imitate the movement, I dodged an excited schoolboy, a street vendor, and a stray dog to catch up to my parents and my sister,



who had already begun to move forward. The flurry of people left me breathless.

My thoughts were soon interrupted by sudden, loud honking and blares emitted from the automobiles traveling through the road that filled the air as we pressed forward. I didn't cover my ears, however. The clatter of the rickshaw autos and bicycles gave the street a lively atmosphere, which provided a unique contrast to the buzzing atmosphere of American highways.

After a short drive, we arrived at our family home. I was soon surrounded by cousins, aunts, uncles, and grandparents that I hadn't seen in years - but even time can't wear these ties. Within minutes I feel at home in the crowd, surrounded by the people who, despite the time I had spent separated from them, cared for me the most. The chatter that bounces back and forth among my relatives kept me engaged and alert. Everyone in my family is so different, with varied personalities, interests, and idea - the diversity made it difficult to get bored. I learned how one of my cousins is planning on going back to college to get her MBA, and how my aunt was planning to move forward with her job as a teacher for children with learning disabilities. My trip gave me a chance to reestablish connections with a family that was larger than I initially thought.

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In the evening, my uncle offered me a scooter ride. We soon began to tour the streets of Odisha, the wind whipping at our faces and clothes. The excursion may seem ordinary and unremarkable, but in reality, it instilled one of the strongest feelings of delight I had ever known. We were greeted with aromas of masala *chai*, *gupchup*, *chat*, and Indian sweets. The countless small shops and stands that pepper the landscape present a diverse collection of new smells and tastes that made me salivate. The opportunity to tear across the streets, encountering countless people and exploring gave me an experience unique among others. My previous appeal for gadgets and video games faded as my desire to get out and explore a new world grew.

Towards the end of my visit, my family made one last stop: Puri. I remember stepping barefoot on the rocky ground of the Puri temples. People swarmed about as I stared into the giant faces of Lord Jagannath, Balabhadra, and Subhadra. I was used to seeing small pictures or paintings of the trio - the enormity of the statues caught me off guard.

"Why don't they have arms?" I asked my mother.

"God cannot interfere with our lives to give us what we want," she replied. "We have to work for what we want ourselves. Praying to God will do nothing without effort." I internalized the statement. The



air made me shiver, despite the warmth of the place. There's a power of the temple that can only be felt if you are there. Puri is known for its food and sights, but it is primarily a center of overwhelming belief. After a few hours amidst the tide of faith, I agreed to go back to my grandparent's home, reluctantly leaving the beacon of hope behind.

Leaving India was more difficult than I had expected. I had come expecting a multitude of insect bites, illnesses, and run-down buildings. Instead, I received a journey to explore my family, culture, and identity. I may have left the land that I came from, but there is always a part of me that is still there.
